COVID-19: The community of Salluit remains COVID-19 free

Kuujjuaq, July 17, 2020 – Despite the recent announcement of a positive case of COVID-19 in Salluit from an individual from out-of-region, the Nunavik Regional Board of Health and Social Services (NRBHSS) is pleased to announce and confirm that the community of Salluit has remained and continues to be considered COVID-19 free.

Appropriate preventive measures were taken to ensure that this situation did not pose a risk to the population. Regular community activities were not immobilized and continue to carry on.

In addition, the NRBHSS is increasing the screening requirement of its' *Management of Travelers' Program*.

Furthermore, the NRBHSS would like to thank to the municipality of Salluit for their rapid collaboration and proactivity in ensuring safety measures were taken and applied in a timely manner.

Everyone must do their part to reduce and limit the spread of the virus. Everyone is urged to comply with the following measures:

- Wash your hands frequently for at least 20 seconds.
- Respect a distance of two meters between each another.
- Respect the public health guidelines.
