

ORDINANCE 2021-16-1

Date: **November 14, 2021**

Subject: Restrictions on travel between Nunavik communities - **Update**

WHEREAS the rapid evolution of the transmission of COVID-19 in the communities of Nunavik;

WHEREAS the importance of community transmission in Nunavik communities;

WHEREAS community transmission has been documented in three of the seven Hudson Coast communities;

The regional director of public health, acting in accordance with article 106 of the Public Health Act, maintains restrictions on travel to and from Nunavik communities until further notice in order to limit the spread of COVID- 19:

- Only persons belonging to the following categories are authorized to travel to and from the communities of Nunavik, regardless of the means of transport, until further notice:

- those required to travel to provide or receive essential services in the sectors of education, public safety, justice, health, social services, day-care services, municipal services, telecommunications, airport operations, mining sector, construction and maintenance work deemed essential as well as their dependants who reside in the region;
- those required to travel for humanitarian reasons;
- those whose work involves commercial transport of goods or persons in the region;
- those required to travel to that community under a court order.

It is the responsibility of Nunavik organizations to assess the relevance of travel for their employees, consultants or contractors. In the case of people traveling for health care, social services or youth protection, this responsibility belongs to the health center. Thus, each organization must consider the extent to which travel of an employee, consultant, contractor – and client in the case of a health center – is essential and cannot be postponed. The reservation of a ticket via the TMS system is proof of the authorization to travel.

People whose scheduled flight is not funded by an organization must apply for a travel authorization at: covid-lockdown.nrbhss@ssss.gouv.qc.ca or by calling 1-855-797-6592.

People traveling by chartered flight must send their request for authorization to the address: covid-charter.flights.nrbhss@ssss.gouv.qc.ca.

The Nunavik territory access authorization request process (AATN) continues to apply for travel from outside Nunavik.

- Travelers are required to comply with entry management measures (screening and quarantine) applicable to the community of departure and the community of destination.

- Regular flights between the communities of the Hudson Coast and the communities of the Ungava Coast can resume from November 19, 2021.
