







## Progressive Reopening Recommendations to the Population for Bingo Sales in Nunavik 2020

The following guidelines should be considered a preliminary measure to the reopening of the region. Other guidelines will follow, and the present guidelines are implemented in a context of COVID free communities. The guidelines can always change, based on the evolution of the situation in the region.

Bingo, in Nunavik, normally occurs biweekly, through the FM. Since the activity occurs through the FM, it is permitted.

Our knowledge on modes of transmission of the virus is in constant evolution; there are no safe numbers.

## **General Guidelines for bingo**

- Bingo should occur through the FM, only.
  \*We would like to remind people that indoor gatherings are still limited to 5 visitors—Refer to guidelines on gatherings and get together.
- Nevada Ticket Sales Should Not Occur
- People should not be able to choose their bingo cards in order to avoid contact with the sheets. We recommend that the committees randomize the cards.
- Prizes should be delivered to winners in envelopes or through EMT.
  \*Recommendations on delivery below apply to the delivery of prizes as well.
- The people involved in the sale of bingo cards or the delivery of prizes should not be doing so if they have symptoms: fever, cough, shortness of breath, diarrhea, head or body aches or fatigue, loss of smell or taste. These people should call the Health-Line at 1-888-662-7482.











The bingo card sales usually occur at the community centres and the forums in each community. With the community centres and forums remaining closed, for the time being, it is recommended to hold sales outside these establishments until they are reopened. Bingo card sales can occur through 2 modes, depending on the size of the community and means of each recreation committee.

Committees can choose to either make bingo card sales outside, or through delivery.

## Recommendations regarding outdoor bingo card sales

- The sales of bingo cards should be done outside, in an open space. We recommend the use of pop-up tents consisting of only a roof (no closed spaces).
- People should have a distance of 2 metres between them. There should be markings on the ground to indicate 2 metres between each client lining-up. \*We recommend that a committee member wearing a mask supervises the line.
- People should avoid any type of physical contact, such as handshaking and hugging.
- An alcohol-based hand sanitizer should be available on site and people should be highly encouraged to disinfect their hands upon arrival.
- People should **designate one person per household** to go purchase the bingo cards to limit the number of people present on site.
- Recreation committee members should wear masks and wash their hands between each transaction. Especially with money handling. They should try to limit manipulation of cards, money, and EMT machines as much as possible.
- Non-cash payments should be encouraged. Exact cash amounts as well.
- EMT machines, if used, should be sanitized regularly, using alcohol swabs.
- People going to purchase bingo cards and recreation committee members should not partake if they have symptoms: fever, cough, shortness of breath, diarrhea, head or body aches or fatigue, loss of smell or taste. These people should call the Health-Line at 1-888-662-7482.











## Recommendations regarding bingo card sales delivery

- Bingo cards should be delivered to homes by a maximum of 2 recreation committee members.
- Clients should call ahead to order the number of cards they would like to purchase, and should have the exact amount of cash for payment upon delivery.
- Recreation committee members should wear masks and stay in the entrance of the home during the delivery.
- Recreation committee members should stay 2 metres apart from the household members at all times and they should avoid physical contact such as handshaking and hugging.
- Committee members should have an alcohol-based hand sanitizer on hand to disinfect their hands before and after each delivery.
- Committee members should have envelopes on hand for the customers to drop the exact cash payments into, in order to avoid contact as much as possible.
- A committee member should be in charge of compiling the money from all the envelopes, at the end. They should wear a mask and should wash their hands with soap and water once the money has been handled.
- People ordering bingo cards and committee members should not take part if they have symptoms: fever, cough, shortness of breath, diarrhea, head or body aches or fatigue, loss of smell or taste. These people should call the Health-Line at 1-888-662-7482.
