

GRADUAL REOPENING OF THE REGION BY THE NREPAC

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Curfew now from 11PM to 4 AM.

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Some restrictions regarding the sale of alcohol are lifted.

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Nunavimmiut may follow the provincial measure that allows small outdoor get-togethers.

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Joint press release (NRBHSS, KI, KMHB, KRG, NVs) regarding the inter-organizational efforts in working on the gradual reopening of the region.

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- Re-opening of greenhouses and community gardening initiatives
- Golf activities
- Travel North North
- Hunting, fishing and harvesting with people from other households
- In-door small get-togethers are permitted but outdoor get-togethers should be favored

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Nunavik is declared COVID-19-free, 28 days after the last active case was declared recovered.

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- Sealift and transportation of fuel are authorized for the summer
- Announce that each community will create a Harbour Master position
- Access to Nunavik Parks and outfitters is authorized for the summer for maintenance only

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Reopening of the Air Inuit website and phone line for the booking of regional flights

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- Reopening of daycares and restaurants
- Reopening of Landholdings and other private and public work places

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Lifting of the curfew and all the restrictions on the sale of alcohol

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Resumption of Air Inuit regional flights

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Opening of day camps

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- Outdoor sports are permitted
- Bingo can resume
- Ecotourism and outfitting activities allowed for local residents and temporary workers, with preventive measures
- Access to Nunavik Parks to local residents and temporary workers allowed, with preventive measures

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Reopening of work offices (e.g. KRG)

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- Opening of Traditional and Cultural Camps for youths aged 12+
- Opening of Youth Houses is allowed
- Opening of swimming pools is allowed
- Opening of gymnasiums and fitness centers

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Reopening of the Construction sector with restrictions and preventive measures
