

²ESSENTIALS TRAVELS

Humanitarian reasons, court order, to obtain care or services required for health, essential service provider

⁴BEING ADEQUATELY PROTECTED FOR QUARANTINE PURPOSE

A person adequately protected and exempt from quarantine, in the context of a trip to Nunavik, is a person who has received a booster dose (3rd dose) of a COVID-19 vaccine at least 14 days prior to travel OR who had COVID-19 confirmed by a test and has received 2 doses of a COVID-19 vaccine where the prescribed minimum intervals between vaccines and infection have been observed.

**

An **unprotected** person is a person who does not meet the previous definition. This definition currently includes people under the age of 18 for whom booster doses have not yet been approved.

QUARANTINE

Any traveler from the South or from a community at the Red or Orange+ alert level that is not fully protected with 3 doses of vaccine must quarantine for 10 days in the North, in the South, or a combination of both.

If the booster shot has been received fewer than 10 days prior to travel, the number of days remaining is to be completed by quarantining.

This applies to each trip.

SCREENING:

Travels South–North and North–North:

- Screening (excluding rapid antigen tests) are mandatory 48-72 hours prior to departure and on Day 5 after arriving in a community. This applies to people travelling from the South, and to and from a community under Orange+ or Red Alert level.
- In addition to the test at the CLSC on Day 5, it is highly recommended to perform rapid tests provided at the airport on the day of travel (Day 0) as well as on Days 2, 4, 6 and 8.

Travelling for less than 72 hours:

North-South-North travel:

- Screening before returning to Nunavik is not required.
- Screening on Day 5 is still required. South-North-South travel:
- Only pre-departure screening is required.
- Screening on Day 5 is not required.
