The Nunavik population has more than doubled since the 1980s...



The hospitals of Kuujuaq (UTHC) and Puvirnituk (IHC), built in the 1980s, can no longer accommodate major service development.



Service development has therefore occurred in Montreal rather than Nunavik, which means travel for patients...



...For patients, such travel represents major inconveniences...



...Such as being separated from their loved ones, having to find someone to look after their children, losing income...



...As well as being isolated in an environment where the care provided is not adapted to their culture.



The Government of Quebec funds transportation for beneficiaries of the JBNQA for access to services outside Nunavik. However, the number of trips has risen exponentially...

The Clinical Plan is a document submitted to the *Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux (MSSS)* for study and approval.



OBJECTIVES OF THE CLINICAL PLAN

Clearly define the need, propose the necessary clinical solutions to respond to the need, and draw up infrastructure scenarios to enable support for clinical organization and respond to the current needs and for 20 years after infrastructure construction.

IN TWO POINTS...

1. Document the present situation of health and social services in Nunavik in order to define a service supply adapted to the situation in Nunavik;
2. Define a regional, unified perspective for the development of health and social services in Nunavik.



GOAL OF THE PROJECT

Carry out the first step toward a regional hospital.

A REGIONAL HOSPITAL TO:

- Reduce the cost of patient transportation;
- Reduce waiting times for access to treatment;
- Reduce inconveniences for patients and their families;
- Offer culturally sensitive services;
- Ensure greater patient assiduity for their appointments;
- Offer specialized services in Nunavik.

STEPS IN THE

Profile of the institutions and population

STEP 01

- Re-establish a context for the organizational situation of the NRBHSS and the two health institutions.

- Describe the population's health profile (epidemiological perspective).

- Detail the current service supply and consumption (qualitative and quantitative): installations and buildings, human and financial resources, training, etc.

- Identify service shortcomings relative to health needs now and in 2040.

STEP 02

Profile of the situation and services

Draft regional service supply

STEP 03

Respond to the needs and the will to deal with the identified shortcomings in services.

- Definition of needs in human, financial and information resources to determine the regional needs for space and surface area.

- Development of several scenarios.
