

NUNAVIK: MOVING FORWARD SAFELY

Overall summary of recommendations for Nunavik during COVID-19 pandemic

What can I do and where to refer?

For level 1 and 2, gatherings: as long as social distancing can be respected:

- Private indoor or outdoor gatherings: a total of 10 people or 5 guests maximum (whichever is highest in each situation)
- Places of worship: 250 people maximum (when not speaking or singing)
- Indoor public activities, 50 people maximum
- Outdoor public activities: 250 people maximum
